
When a person trains or works in 1 job, they acquire skills for 13 other jobs, on average



GROWTH IN THE DEMAND FOR ENTERPRISE SKILL SETS






ACADEMIC OVERVIEW





COMPLETION OF SENIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE






PERCENTAGE STUDYING AN ATAR PACKAGE




