From the Principal



*Dear Parents/Carers,
Staff and Students,*

A very belated welcome back to Term 2, given that we are already at the end of the third week of term. Like Term 1, this is another short term

filled with many important events and activities. As we go about these relatively 'normal' day-to-day activities, can I take this opportunity to remind our families that we need to remain vigilant in relation to COVID-19 and the advice we continue to receive from ACT Health. Thank you to those families who have followed our protocols and the advice of ACT Health and have kept their students at home when they have been experiencing cold and flu symptoms ensuring that our community remains as healthy as possible.

I have had the privilege this week to spend two days on retreat with the Chevalier Institute at Douglas Park, just south of Sydney. Douglas Park is the spiritual home of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart in Australia and being able to be immersed within the MSC community who reside there, their Spirituality of the Heart, and to be able to follow and walk in the footsteps that so many within the wider Chevalier family have before me, was a truly special and powerful experience.

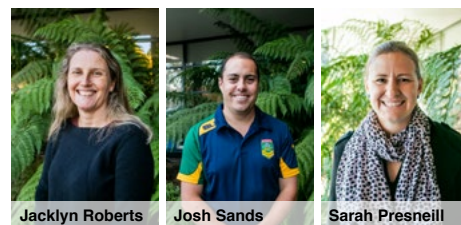

Vaping and E-Cigarettes

Recent media reports, notably in the Canberra Times over the past week, highlighted that vaping is becoming widespread amongst young people. Vaping products are being cleverly marketed, especially on social media platforms, despite vaping being illegal for those under the age of 18, and has become a growing problem which schools and parents are concerned about. Given the nature of vaping devices they can be difficult to easily

detect. We have been working with our staff to alert them to the appearance of these devices so that they can recognise and identify them should they come across them here at school. Students in Years 7 to 12 have participated in a pastoral lesson delivered by our Pastoral Team that included reliable and credible information about the health concerns and legalities around the use of vapes. Families are encouraged to access

with their student the following link from ACT Health which provides comprehensive information about vaping and a variety of images of e-cigarettes, <https://www.health.act.gov.au/sites/default/files/2019-05/Electronic%20cigarettes.pdf>. Families can be reassured that the College takes this issue very seriously and will work with students and families closely when issues arise. Should families have information or concerns about this issue, they are encouraged to speak in the first instance with their student's Pastoral Leader.

STEM Professional Visit

On Wednesday 31 March, the Maths Department welcomed **Dr Joan Licata** for an afternoon of enrichment activities for students in Years 7 and 11. We have been working with Dr Licata since 2014 as part of the CSIRO STEM Professionals in Schools program.

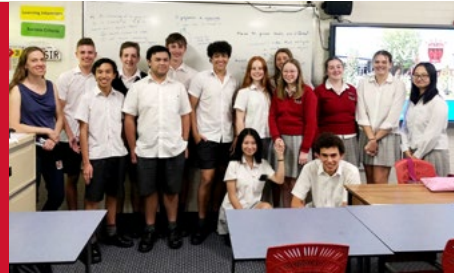
Dr Licata is a Senior Lecturer in the Mathematical Sciences Institute at

ANU. Her research area is geometric topology, and she has shared with our students just a fragment of what topology is all about.

Year 11 delved into the world of knots and their link to work in DNA. Students are now able to throw words such as trefoil, achiral, invariant, isotopy and

colourability into their conversation. We may never look at a Caraway seed in quite the same way.

Year 7 were blown away by the Euler characteristic and probably dreamt all night about doughnuts and triangles after their investigative task.

Year 10 iSTEM class report

Students in Year 10 iSTEM classes have studied the use of prosthetic limbs and were required to develop a mechanism to achieve a specific goal. Whilst using the design process, students were given the brief to hold a soft drink can and lift it off a bench 100mm. To operate different parts

of the prosthetic limb, students used hydraulics within medical components.

Various designs were developed - with creative flair - and all students achieved the required goal of lifting a soft drink can 100mm off a bench.



Languages

As part of our end of Term One festivities and exploration of German cultural traditions, Year 10 German students spent a lesson hand painting eggs. Colourful, intricately hand painted eggs are an Easter tradition in many European cultures, including Germany. These are used to decorate houses in the lead up to Easter and can be seen hanging on branches inside and outdoors.

Students brought in their own blown out eggs and put their fine motor skills and creativity to

the test. We searched for some inspiration pictures, then got to work bringing our ideas to reality. We quickly found that the intricate designs required even more time, skills, and patience than we had initially thought... but by the end of the lesson, almost everyone had finished decorating at least one egg they were proud of. Painting our own eggs gave us a greater appreciation for this art form and a chance to experience a small part of German culture before our own Easter celebrations with our families.



In the first week of Term 2, Year 11 and 12 students from St Edmund's, St Clare's and Daramalan College had their Senior Japanese Immersion together. Here are some reflections from students.

"My experience with the Japanese Excursion was very enjoyable. It was nice to have a day wherein we could converse fully in Japanese. At first it was quite a surprise to only be conversing in our non-native language, however, after the day's activities it had become much easier to articulate my ideas in Japanese. Making chopsticks and enjoying authentic Japanese cuisine was excellent fun. Tragically, my chopsticks did not have such a great time. Immersing ourselves within the culture that we have been studying for so long was an excellent experience, not only for my journey in learning the language, but understanding the culture that lay behind it."

Yamaguchi-san taught us how to make the chopsticks, and he taught us all about polite chopstick etiquette and the correct way to use them. It was a good opportunity to mingle with the other schools and appreciate Japanese culture over a traditional meal. I also liked how we got to play Japanese activities such as games about Japanese slang words and celebrities. It was fun to collaborate with the other students and be competitive. I think it helped improve my Japanese skills. Overall, I enjoyed the day and would love to go back in the future."

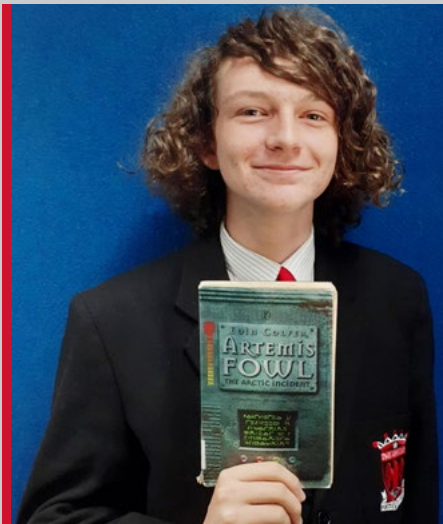
Here are some book reviews from our members:

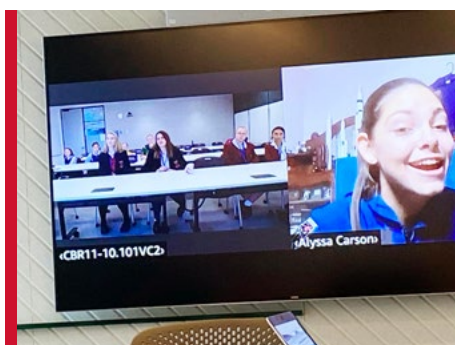


Alyssa Carson: 20-year-old astronaut and on track to be the first woman on Mars
