From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers, Staff and Students.

A belated welcome back to Term 4. As we come to the end of the third week of an already short term, the year seems to be passing by very quickly. Despite

Chevalier Day

Fr Chevalier died in Issoudun, France, on 21 October 1907, 115 years ago, however, his work lives on through those who followed his mission. As an MSC school, we are part of a bigger Chevalier family with whom this mission continues. Fr Chevalier's charism finds its origins in his great passion for Jesus Christ, who loves with a human heart. He believed in the
















Rationale:

The story and message of Shrek the Musical Jr. will live on in our memories for many years to come.












Lyons Bake Sale
