# From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers, Staff and Students.





# **Science Snippets**

Science students at Daramalan have started the year with a variety of experiments and learning new skills. Some of our Language students are participating in the OzClo competition (Australian Computational and Linguistic Olympia) and have already started their training sessions during lunchtime this week.



# Over 90,500 views for Daramalan Theatre Company Movie



Putting this into perspective, other movies in the play list such as Brittany Murphy's first movie, "Family Prayers" has 46,000 views and Brittany Murphy's "Victim of the Night" has 32,000. All cast for Daramalan Theatre Company (DTC)'s production of "Troilus and Cressida" attended an intensive camp at Burrill Pines Convention Centre in December 2022, just before Christmas and after the school year had officially finished. It was a necessary component needed for the development of a highly effective production. It proved to be one of the most intensive and focused camps the company has seen. While all but one of the members had been to a Burrill Pines camp before, this was quite different to previous intensives; all cast members took very seriously what was being offered them. It meant real progress was made in developing performance techniques and approaches.

Over the last twenty three years, DTC teachers, cast members and some crew have spent many hours of holiday and weekend time devoted to producing the highest standards of theatrical presentation.

DTC had a big year in 2022. "The Trojan Women" appealed to a coterie audience beyond Daramalan while "Shrek" proved to be a theatre of excellence with some cast members invited to be part of another production of "Shrek" from Pied Piper Productions. Both "The Trojan Women" and "Shrek" received CAT Awards, while **Harper Ward** (Year 11) received an individual achievement award for his performance in "Shrek". I think DTC and all participants should be congratulated for a big year!



But one is only as good as one's current task! And DTC has never shirked a challenge.

The reality of performing for public audiences demands an emotional and physical toughness that can be learnt. Routines, rituals and specific techniques and approaches can be utilised to assist in this development. DTC workshops aim to provide the detachment and necessary confidence to step from one's private self on to the public platform of the stage. The fun and intensity of the Burrill Pines camp helps to achieve this aim in a way that is difficult in the school classroom.

This was certainly evident at the December 2022 camp.

Cooking for each other, workshopping, participating in seminars and rituals and providing affirmations are the pillars on which the camp builds a solid platform for effective and confident performance.

DTC should see the results in strong and compelling performances in 2023.

# Troilus and Cressida

# Creating ripples in our cosmos of community and relationships.

We have begun rehearsals in earnest for Shakespeare's "Troilus and Cressida" adapted by Tony Allan. Students came back early on Saturday 28 January, before school had officially begun. In true form for Daramalan Theatre Company (DTC) activists and members, all cast turned up.

There is a work ethic that goes beyond co-curricular and individual success. It might be abstract. It might be a vague hunch that leads individuals to devote so much energy and time into ideals and into seemingly unrewarded achievements that follow from theatrical work that is not within the usually accepted areas so often promoted in amateur and community theatre.

Their efforts equate with elite sporting achievements and training. Their efforts combine philosophy, art, academic studies in literature and the humanities. There is a future for our culture and our society when this level of commitment can be quantified and viewed within the context of elevation and sacrifice.

Art and spirituality coexist from ancient times. Working on Shakespeare's "Troilus and Cressida" provides more than finding acting credentials that might aid in landing roles in some superficially significant community effort or even in assisting in landing a place in a truly significant acting school. It is more about finding one's personal Dharma: that life's journey or pathway that one can find to truly and fully achieve one's potential.

Our theatre company is about stillness, silence and then explosion! It is a big bang experience that cast and crew need to be aware of and feel its power. Hopefully our audiences will also experience something of this power and this burst of energy and challenge to re-evaluate everything.

DTC wishes to inspire young people to take up the challenge of inspiring our community and our audiences to see that they have the power to change and challenge. Our theatre is a vehicle for this.

"Troilus and Cressida" is far more than a seventeenth century play. It is an awkward play by Shakespeare that was never fully realised. However, we believe it can create ripples in our cosmos of community and relationships. It is Shakespeare's most youth orientated play and one that has the greatest resonance for youth of 2023. While certainly not a feminist play, it is centuries ahead of its time and nullifies the view of Shakespeare as a misogynist writer.

We invite audiences to see this work of Shakespeare's given the Daramalan Theatre Company treatment, to present it as if for the first time ever!

And as an added bonus for audiences, we will provide a bar and café for light refreshments. Even the bar will be part of the entertainment, with cast with RSAs providing character portrayals while serving drinks.

"Troilus and Cressida" is a once in a decade experience and one that audiences and cast will remember for the rest of their lives.

It will certainly create ripples in our cosmos of community and relationships.


