Will Canavan (Year 11) who has been selected as a member of the ACT team competing at the U18s National Basketball Championships in Brisbane over the holiday period.

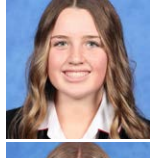
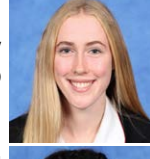
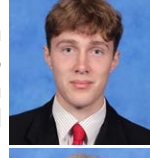
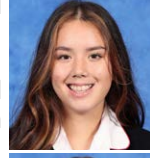
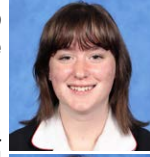
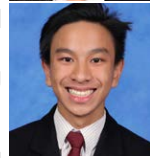
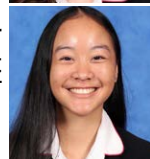

HASS

Earlier in the term, Year 12 Modern History students, as part of their unit on Germany 1919 – 1945, were privileged to have the opportunity to meet Ana, a Holocaust survivor, from Courage to Care. Ana was born in 1935 in a northern province of the former Yugoslavia and lived there until 1943, when she was forced to move to a Jewish ghetto run by the Nazis. In 1944 she was sent to the German concentration camp Bergen-Belsen where she spent seven months. Several of her family members perished in the camp, but amazingly her mother, her grandparents and Ana survived. Her story of survival serves as a reminder of the horrors of the past and the importance of learning about these events to ensure that history does not repeat itself. Our students greatly appreciated the opportunity to hear Ana's story.



Business and Government

On Friday 24 March, two teams of Year 11 students undertook a remarkable challenge as they competed in the inaugural Secondary Schools Global Challenge hosted by the Canberra Grammar Centre for Global Citizenship and the Australian National University. The students devoted their lunchtimes to prepare for the Challenge by delving into briefing materials and acquainting themselves with the structure of the day, in order to confidently take on their assigned roles as part of the simulation.

The challenge entailed a hypothetical yet realistic crisis simulation on the Korean Peninsula, with a particular focus on nuclear-armed North Korea and its relationship with non-governmental organisations, and major state actors such as China, Australia, South Korea, the United States, and media outlets.

Each team was designated a role and provided with background briefs and readings. Our teams were allocated the roles of Australia and the Global Times, an English language newspaper that serves as the mouthpiece of the Chinese Communist Party.

During the simulation, teams were presented with two hypothetical situations regarding North Korea and had roughly an hour and a half to negotiate with other teams before presenting a two-minute speech outlining their actor's response to the situation. Both teams demonstrated their prowess in taking on their assigned roles and promptly initiated negotiations, culminating in well-articulated responses to the other participants.

At the end of the day, our Global Times team was awarded second place by the judges, commending their persuasive presentations that adeptly embodied China's perspective on international affairs. An impressive achievement amidst a field of highly proficient and committed Global Politics students! Congratulations to all the students who participated.



Earth and Environmental Science

Pond Dipping at the Botanical Gardens

Year 12 Earth and Environmental Science students visited the Botanical Gardens to investigate water quality as part of their 'Living on Earth' unit. Armed with nets and buckets, the students set out to discover what macroinvertebrates could be found in the pond. The presence and abundance of these creatures can give an indication of water quality, as some are more tolerant of pollution than others.

Over the course of the investigation, the students found a range of macroinvertebrates, including dragonfly nymphs, water beetles and freshwater snails. The excursion was a great success, with the students gaining valuable hands-on experience and a deeper understanding of the importance of maintaining healthy waterways.

Year 11 and 12 Earth and Environmental Science Fieldtrip to Wollongong

Year 11 and 12 students recently embarked on an exciting Earth and Environmental Science field trip to Wollongong, where they had the opportunity to explore the natural wonders of the region and undertake field work comparing and contrasting rainforest and open forest ecosystems.

The trip started with a visit to the Illawarra Fly Rainforest Zipline tour, where the students got a bird's-eye view of the rainforest canopy and learned about the importance of preserving these fragile ecosystems. They were thrilled to zip along the treetops and observe the diverse flora and fauna that make up the rainforest habitat. Next, the group visited Jamberoo Action Park, where they had an action-packed afternoon of water rides and fun in the sun.

On Monday, the students conducted fieldwork on Mt Kiera comparing cleared and uncleared rainforest and open forest ecosystems. They collected data on the exotic species, soil type, light, pH, and vegetation of each area, analysing the impact of human intervention on these ecosystems. Through this hands-on experience, and legs covered in leeches, students gained a deeper understanding of the complex relationships between different components of the natural world.

Overall, the Wollongong field trip was a fantastic opportunity for our Year 11 and 12 students to deepen their knowledge of Earth and Environmental Science while also having fun and exploring new places. We look forward to future trips that will engage our students, develop their field work experience, and broaden their horizons.



Science

Year 11 Biology Excursion

Earlier this month, Year 11 Biology had an exciting field trip to a rock shelf at South Durras to conduct a transect and quadrat study. The main objective of the study was to link abiotic data to the distribution and abundance of organisms.

Despite the challenging weather conditions, the class was determined to carry out the study. The students divided into groups and walked along the transect line, recording data about temperature, light, humidity and wind speed as well as the types of organisms found. The students noted that some organisms were only found at specific areas along the transect.

The experience was a great opportunity for the students to apply concepts they had learned in class in a real-world setting. The adverse weather conditions also presented a valuable lesson in adaptability and resilience, demonstrating that even in unfavourable conditions, scientific research can still be conducted. Our fantastic driver, Dave, made sure we travelled safely and allowed us to take cover in the coach despite our rather soggy situation.

Overall, the field trip was a great success, and the students gained valuable insights into the interplay between abiotic factors and the biodiversity of organisms in a natural setting. Despite the huge amount of rainfall (that was not reported on the weather App!), we all had a great time.



Psychology

Year 11 Psychology Zoo Excursion

On Tuesday 21 March and Wednesday 22 March, the Year 11 Psychology students had the opportunity to visit the National Zoo and Aquarium as part of their studies on learning and behaviour. The trip was an exciting and hands-on way for the students to learn about classical and operant conditioning, two key theories in the field of Psychology.

The class got to experience these concepts first-hand as they interacted with the animals at the zoo. They were able to feed emus, deer and alpacas, and observe how the animals responded to the reinforcement of receiving food.

The highlight of the visit for many students was the chance to hold a small corn snake! Some students were incredibly excited by this, others were able to face their fears in a safe and controlled environment – a positive experience for all!

Overall, the trip to the National Zoo and Aquarium was an engaging and memorable way for the Year 11 Psychology students to learn about key concepts in their studies. By getting hands-on experience with classical and operant conditioning, as well as observing animal behaviour and learning, the students gained a deeper understanding of the theories they have been studying in class.



Food Technology

FishCo Market Visit

Our Year 11 Hospitality class was lucky enough to venture to the FishCo Fish Market in Fyshwick on Tuesday 14 March. This was an incredible experience for all students involved as we were immersed in one of Canberra's largest seafood and fish suppliers. After a bumpy bus ride, we arrived at the FishCo Markets and were greeted by the enthusiastic and passionate Managing Director **John Fragopoulos**. John immersed the students in the world of marine life and demonstrated his extensive knowledge and his views on ensuring a sustainable seafood industry. He briefly explained the logistics of running a fish market and how FishCo has had to adapt due to the Covid-19 pandemic in recent years.

As we toured the store, the students were encouraged to try a variety of seafood which resulted in some exhilarating and amusing experiences. During this

process, students were encouraged to try freshly shucked oysters and to interact with marine life by handling live mud crabs and lobsters and fishing by hand for Barramundi in his live tank. John explained how to ensure perishable seafood remains at its freshest through correct transportation and storage practices. When one particularly excited and passionate student was interacting with a yabby, John was kind enough to gift it to them as a pet called Murray. He told her how to keep it alive by keeping it in water and feeding it carrots. John also taught the students how to peel tiger prawns using the best technique.

To conclude the excursion, the students would like to thank John for this incredible experience and the offer to take Murray, the pet yabby, back to school; who was served with a yummy cocktail sauce and a wedge of lemon the following day.

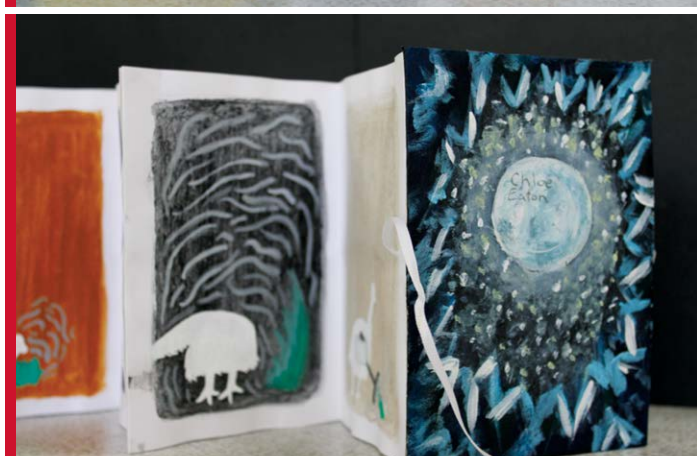
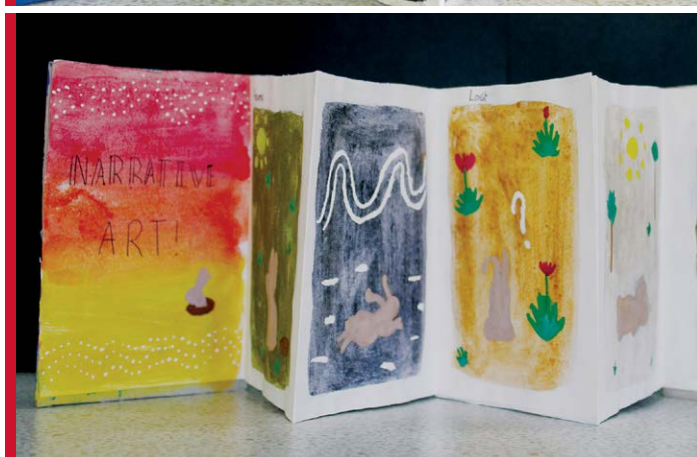

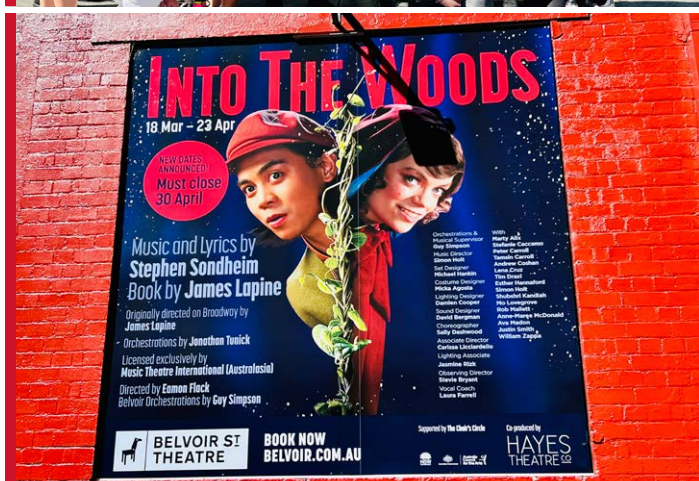


Dance and Drama Sydney Excursion

Daramalan Theatre Company's "Troilus and Cressida" by Shakespeare

DTC's forthcoming production of Shakespeare's "Troilus and Cressida" is a contemporary work. It is no longer simply an historical piece as represented by it's being the least presented Shakespeare play. The shyness and patriarchal viewpoints that give rise to so much theatrical production mean that "Troilus and Cressida" is an almost forgotten work. Perhaps it is preferred to be forgotten; perhaps misunderstood and clearly discarded because of the ambiguous nature of female sexuality in a theatrical context! The male writer cannot claim to know the female psyche; just as the female experience of male monsters is a subject hidden by centuries of fear and a lack of conscious appreciation of the reality of relationships.

Boys and young men need to see this work of Shakespeare's to understand how they might be in turn be perceived by militant young women who no longer wish to appease the posturing and brutish behaviour of young men and their friends and their desire to seduce, humiliate or dominate. Yet somehow, after these centuries of humiliation and domination, there is empathy and even an expression of love and a truly felt connection to the slaughtered corpse of male superiority. You must not miss this extraordinary work by some truly outstanding young Artists assisted by our Artist-in-Residence, **Jack Curry**. It will change your very perception of Shakespeare and perhaps raise questions of your own.

Ball skills practices:

Activity	Explanation	Coaching Points & Tips
The Arch (crosses indicate where the ball must hit the wall) 	1 player, 1 ball. -Player stands 1m away from the wall. -Facing the wall, and holding the ball at full extension in one hand pass the ball in an arch shape. When the player reaches the top of the arch, swap arms and complete the other side of the arch	-Ensure the arm is always at full extension. -Use finger tips to cushion and push the ball. -Ensure the transition from left to right hand at the top of the arch is quick. -Start off slowly and then try to speed up. Progression: use two balls, 1 in each hand-start with both balls out to either side then meet in the middle.
The Side Arch 	1 player, 1 ball. -Player stands 1m away from the wall, side on to the wall. -Holding the ball at full extension behind them, pass the ball in an arch shape until their arm is at full extension in front of them.	-Use finger tips to cushion and push the ball. -Maintain upright, do not twist or bend.
Alternate arms 	1 player, 2 balls. -Player stands 3m away from the wall, facing it. -Player completes alternate shoulder passes, ensuring that the passes are hard, fast and flat	-Try to mirror the technique of the dominant hand with non dominant hand (both throwing arms should look and feel the same, with the same result). -To break down the throwing technique use a tennis ball instead of a netball. Progression: increase distance away from the wall.
Anywheres 	1 player, 1 ball. -Player stands 2m away from the wall, facing it. Leonard ran a session for over 25 Daramalan Coaches. The 2-hour session was drills-based and included explanations and demonstrations of well over 20 drills suitable for all ages from JPL to the lower divisions. Leonard's mantra is to develop talent and maximise participation and the drills he introduced the Coaches to were aligned to this philosophy ensuring athletes would not be standing around in lines for long periods of time during training sessions. The Daramalan Coaches were actively involved and were demonstrators of drills, asked questions and were able to seek Leonard's assistance for specific skill and mind-set development. Leonard also chatted extensively to interested Coaches after the session had formally ended and got to catch up with a former teammate and our current U16 D4 Boys megastar Coach **Rob Foote**.
