From the Principal

If your child tests positive to Covid-19

You must notify the College if your child is diagnosed with Covid-19. This allows the College to track if there is an increase in Covid-19 transmission at school and manage any high-risk exposures for our more vulnerable school community members. Notifying the College will continue by completing the Covid-19 Declaration Form on Daranet. As with other infectious diseases, students with Covid-19 symptoms (including runny nose, sore throat, cough, fever) should get tested and must not attend school while they are unwell. The College strongly recommends parents and carers keep their child home for five days if they have Covid-19.

College Hours of Supervision

With school activities now running at full capacity and the lighter evenings approaching, this is a timely reminder to parents and students regarding what supervision is provided before and after normal school hours for the safety of students.

- Active staff supervision is from 8:25am to 3:40pm onsite each day.
- Supervision is provided at organised school events such as rehearsals, trainings or excursions.
- The Uhr Information Centre is supervised from 8:15am to 4:45pm Monday to Thursday and 8:15am to 4:30pm on Fridays.
- Supervision is provided in the Sports Centre during the Winter sports season from 3:30pm to 6.00pm Monday to Thursday where there is a First Aid qualified member of staff available.
- Reception is staffed from 8.30am to 4.30pm each day, after this time there is no active supervision of the pickup area at the front of the College.

The College does not provide supervision and is not responsible for students who are onsite outside of our active supervision roster and who are not participating in an organised school event. In this circumstance students are onsite at their own risk.

We encourage our students to always be responsible and vigilant to ensure safety onsite and around the College grounds. When travelling to and from school, students are asked to travel in groups where possible, notify their parents of their travel paths, maintain awareness of surroundings and report concerns promptly to the College. We do not recommend students being at Dickson before or after school for prolonged periods of time.

2023 NAPLAN Results

This week during PT time, students in Year 7 and Year 9 received their results from the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) which they completed in March. Upon distribution of these results, a key focus of discussion was around the promotion of the growth narrative Daramalan has initiated with every student. Every child can succeed if we measure success as improvement.

As discussed in the letter to all Year 7 and Year 9 parents and carers, it is important to remember that NAPLAN results are just one measure of academic performance on that day of testing. While they provide valuable insights into their literacy and numeracy skills, they do not define the entirety of your student's abilities, intelligence or potential. We use a range of other assessments throughout the year to identify areas where our students need additional support and to celebrate their achievements.

When reviewing your child's NAPLAN results, we ask parents and carers to focus on the growth and progress over time that their child has displayed and not about their comparison to others. Improvement and advancement are crucial indicators of their commitment and dedication to their studies. As educators, we are dedicated to helping every student reach their full potential, and we acknowledge that progress and development occur at different rates for everyone.

If you have any questions or concerns about your child's NAPLAN results or their overall progress, please do not hesitate in contacting the College. Together, we can be committed in our vision to ensure we are a community that inspires learning, nurtures potential and is strong in faith.

Building Progress

Issoudun Wing Performing Arts Centre progress update

I am excited to report that construction is coming along well now that we are less affected by wet weather, and we hope to have the Performing Arts Centre ready for the start of Term 1, 2024. To refresh everyone's memory about the key features of the Issoudun Wing it has a midsize auditorium, a band rehearsal room, greenroom and changerooms, 4 specialist teaching classrooms, 12 music tuition rooms, a staff room and a 2-story atrium foyer with a kitchenette and multi-use box office, which has a total floor area 1,500 square metres.

I am pleased to say that all structural concrete slabs have been poured (apart from landscaping) and structural steel has been fixed to the building which now helps to give us a really good idea of what to expect with the size and shape of the building. The external brickwork and internal walling frames are complete up to level 1 and the ground floor windows will soon be fitted. The roofing will commence in late August, which will then allow the external brickwork to continue and the internal framing to follow. Once the roof is on the builders will commence the internal fixing and finishing trades will start!

Outside the building half the parking has had curbs and guttering poured and we are waiting to have tar laid which will occur in the next week.


Daramalan Theatre Company






