# From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers. Staff and Students.

Welcome to the edition final Daranews for 2023! I can hardly believe that we are already at the end of another year.

# Senior Examinations and AST Familiarisation

I would like to commend our Year 11 and 12 students for the manner in which they approached and undertook their recent end of semester examinations. I would also like to acknowledge the work of Mr Steve Carroll and Mr Brendan Collis to enable the examinations to occur seamlessly. Following the formal examinations, our Year 11 and Year 10 students have participated in AST (ACT Scaling Test) familiarisation sessions. The AST is the only external examination sat by our senior students and it takes place in September of Year 12 for those students studying a T package and who are seeking university entrance. This year our Year 10 students who will be studying a non-tertiary pathway, or Accredited package, in their senior years, attended sessions facilitated by our Assistant Principal Teaching and Learning, Mr Nic Whatman, Careers Advisor, Ms Annette Brady, and Vocational Education Coordinator, Ms Jane Waddleton. I would like to extend my thanks to Mr Andrew Withers, Brendan, Nic, Annette and Jane, for their input into these important sessions.

#### **End of Year**

I am delighted that we continue to be able to welcome our families and wider community back onsite for our end of year events. I would, however, like to take this opportunity to remind those families looking to attend our ceremonies that parking at the College is extremely limited, especially for those events held during school hours. 


#### **Wicked Excursion**

# Health and Physical Education

In Year 8 Health and Physical Education, students delved into a thought-provoking set of experiments designed to shed light on the profound impact of drugs and alcohol on individuals and our society. The activities gave our students an insightful exploration of the consequences associated with substance abuse.

The experiments commenced with an examination of standard drinks, allowing students to compare the volume and strength of different-sized vessels. This hands-on activity provided a tangible understanding of the implications associated with varying levels of alcohol consumption.

Next, the students explored the dangers of cigarette smoking, where they uncovered a startling reality—cigarettes contain over 600 ingredients, unleashing more than 4000 chemicals upon ignition, including 50 known carcinogens. The gravity of this information was underscored as students witnessed a comparison between

cigarette smoke and the vapour emitted by e-cigarettes. In a poignant demonstration in one of our Science lab Fume Cupboards, it became clear that neither smoking nor vaping can be deemed safe—they are equally toxic and represent detrimental health decisions.

To drive the message home, students engaged in an activity simulating the effects of respiratory diseases, such as emphysema, commonly linked to smoking and vaping. This immersive experience served as a stark reminder of the long-term consequences associated with these habits.

The lesson was powerful, and many students commented on their commitment to never engage in smoking or vaping. As Health and Physical Education educators, witnessing such a powerful shift in perspective has to be considered a resounding success. Empowering students with knowledge to make informed choices ensures a healthier and more informed generation.

This experiment not only fostered a deep understanding of the consequences of substance abuse but also ignited a collective commitment to well-being among our students.


