From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers, Staff and Students.

A very belated welcome back to Term 2, given that we are already at the end of the third week of term. As I mentioned in

my Daranews article at the end of last term, Term 1 certainly was a whirlwind of activities and events, and I am sure that Term 2 will bring a similar level of activity around the College if the past three weeks are any indication. We are, however, also heading back into cold and flu season especially now that the weather has started to turn. Unfortunately, we are also not free from Covid-19, which has started to re-emerge amongst our community. Thank you to those families who have continued to follow our protocols and have kept their students at home when they have been experiencing cold and flu

symptoms ensuring that our community remains as healthy as possible.

Next week we will be hosting the Annual General Meetings of the four Australian MSC schools, as we do each year in May. These meetings provide an excellent opportunity for key representatives from the four schools, the MSC Education Members Council, the Provincial Office including the MSC Provincial and Deputy Provincial, as well as members of the Chevalier Institute to come together over three days for a range of meetings. These meetings will provide us with the opportunity to officially welcome the MSC Provincial Superior, Fr Stephen Hackett MSC, to the College for the first time since he was appointed to his role as Provincial.

ANZAC Ceremony and Sports Assembly

We have been able to gather as a community twice already this term. The focus of our opening assembly was our ANZAC commemoration service. The second occasion was to celebrate and

Our ANZAC Ceremony included a poignant and powerful reflection from former College Captain (1996) and current parent, Sarah Watson. Sarah served in the Australian Army from 1997 to 2015, primarily as an Intelligence Officer and also as a French Linguist and Combat Fitness Leader. She had postings around Australia and overseas, including a 7-month deployment in Iraq as a senior strategic intelligence analyst. In 2015, Sarah was medically retired due to PTSD and Depression which led to a challenging period of healing and personal growth. Since then, she has found comfort in sports, competing internationally in Ironman, Cycling and Triathlon, including competing at the Invictus Games. Sarah is an active member of the community supporting other veterans and volunteering her time. Our students who are members of Cadet Units from the Air Force, Army and Navy, were once again key contributors to our ceremony. I would like to acknowledge Ms Amy Thomas for her work in putting together the service, along with our College Leaders and all of the students who played a role, especially Year 10 student Ruby Holden who led the College in the National Anthem.

Last Friday, we gathered for a second time as a whole community, this time to celebrate and acknowledge the achievements of our students at the three sports carnivals held in Term 1: Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country. The assembly also provided our College Leaders the opportunity to outline the achievements, successes and activities within each of their portfolio areas and how students can become involved throughout the term and year ahead. As I mentioned when I

spoke to the students, I am constantly amazed at the activities and co-curricular activities that are available to our students on a daily basis. There is certainly something for everyone, and I urged all students to check the Daily News and become involved.

Counselling Hub



starting a conversation with a young person about mental health

Conversations about mental health are helpful

Family and friends play a vital role in identifying and supporting a young person who's experiencing the impacts of mental ill-health.

Let your young person know that you care about them no matter what they're going through. This is important and helps encourage young people to seek support early to manage the impact of mental ill-health.

Evidence has shown that having supportive loved ones involved in mental health care creates and improves longer lasting, positive outcomes for young people.

Conversations about mental health can be challenging

Talking to young people about mental health can feel hard, especially when you or your young person are uncomfortable talking about sensitive topics like mental health.

There is no 'right way' to have these conversations. Different approaches work better for different people. It's OK to feel unsure about how or when to start these conversations. No one gets these conversations perfect but taking the time to learn more is a great start.

How do I know if I need to have a conversation about mental ill-health?

Family members and friends can often tell when something isn't quite right. You might notice that a young person is acting differently, or there are changes to their behaviour.



Tips for having the conversation

Having a conversation can feel overwhelming. Here are some tips for talking with your young person.

LCheck in with yourself

- Ensure that you're feeling calm and open to listening.
- Consider if it is the right time to have the conversation.
- Be aware of your body language and tone of voice.



2. Setting the scene

- Think about where.
- It can help to be side-by-side rather than looking directly at each other. Perhaps go for a drive, a walk, or somewhere your young person feels comfortable.

3. Be prepared to listen

- Listening to your young person is an important part of the process.
- Take their feelings seriously. Listen carefully, reflect back and don't judge (it can be more useful at times to say nothing than to offer solutions).
- Take a 'you and me vs the problem' approach. This lets them know you'll figure it out together.

Starting the conversation

- There are many ways to start the conversation. You could begin with general and open questions like: how is [e.g., school/sport] going?
- When focusing on more specific thoughts and feelings, '1' statements are important: 'I feel like you/l've noticed you [haven't been yourself lately] – how are things?'

How you talk with your young person will depend on their age and understanding. The language you use should feel natural. If your young person talks about their mental health, reassure them that you're glad and relieved that they're talking to you, you're proud of them, and they're not alone in their journey.



Year 7 Forces



Chemistry- Titration Competition 2024

The Titration Competition occurred after school on Thursday 9 May at the Australian National University. Forty teams from various colleges across ACT competed against each other to accurately conduct titrations and complete calculations to determine the concentrations of unknown solutions. Textiles


Year 9














HELP US EMPOWER YOUTH TO SAY NO TO VAPING
