From the Principal



Dear Parents/ Carers, Staff and Students.

Daramalan Wins ACT Debating Grand Final

Over this semester, two Daramalan teams made up of Year 7 and 8 students have competed in the ACT Debating Union Competition. This competition featured 42 teams from various schools around Canberra, debating a wide range of topics such as the use of performance-enhancing drugs at the Olympics, the banning of animal factory farming, and the recent decision to restrict 16-year-olds from using social media.

We are thrilled to share that one of our teams, consisting of **Danica-Zeta Jonathan**, **Abella Young** and **Reese McGee** (Year 8), won the Grand Final to become the

2024 ACT Junior Premier Debating Champions. These students demonstrated exceptional skill and dedication throughout the semester long competition, securing victories in all but one of their debates. Their ability to think critically, articulate arguments and work cohesively as a team has been impressive and is a testament to their hard work and preparation. All three students also won top ten speaker awards for their individual contributions. With over 150 speakers in the competition, this is an impressive achievement.

Our other team, consisting of **Eve Halliday, Eva Soldo** (Year 7), **Yasi Donelly** and **Elka Ridwanullah** (Year 8), also put up a valiant effort in the competition, winning three of their six debates. Both teams have represented Daramalan with excellence and have been wonderful ambassadors for our school.

Year 10 Law, Politics and Society

In Week 14 our Year 10 students were out and about once again, going beyond the classroom to explore firsthand some of Australia's most important democratic institutions.

Our day began with a visit to the Museum of Australian Democracy at Old Parliament House, where students explored interactive exhibits about activism, influence in politics and having a say in Australian law making. They also had the opportunity to stage a debate in the real Senate room, stepping into the shoes of politicians past.

Next on the itinerary was the High Court, where students learned about some of the country's landmark legal cases and how these decisions continue to impact Australian law and society today. Sitting in the very courtrooms where Australia's most senior judges deliberate, students gained unique insights into the workings of Australia's highest legal institution.

This hands-on experience not only deepened students' understanding of law and government, but also fostered our appreciation for the democratic values and institutions underpinning Australian society.

U.S. Election Incursion

On Wednesday 6 November, students from Years 10 to 12 had the unique opportunity to participate in an incursion day, led by **Mr Jason Paris** and **Ms Bianca Ross** (senior Global Studies team).

Throughout the day, students engaged in real-time analysis of the unfolding election, tracking the democratic process firsthand.

A group of highly engaged students from Years 11-12 Global Studies, Years 11-12 Legal Studies and Year 10 Law, Politics and Society collaborated in seminars,

group discussions and research activities. Together, they assessed campaign strategies, investigated key battleground States and examined voting data as it was being reported live, being among the first to know who would become the next President of the United States.

This experience offered students not only a deeper understanding of the U.S. electoral process, but valuable skills in collaborative research and data analytics. Moving back to their classes, they will assess the impact of the election on domestic, Australian and international policy, and any changes to come.













Science

Year 7 Students Explore Mixtures and Separation Techniques

Our Year 7 students have been diving into the fascinating topic of mixtures and how to separate them. Through hands-on experiments, they learned about various methods such as filtration, distillation and chromatography. These activities not only helped them understand the properties of different substances but also the practical applications of these techniques.

One of the most inspiring aspects of their studies was learning how these scientific principles are used to address real-world challenges, such as providing clean water to communities in need. By understanding how filtration and distillation can remove impurities from water, students gained insight into the importance of science in solving global issues.

Year 8 Students Create Earth Layer Models

Our Year 8 students recently engaged in an exciting project where they created models of the Earth's layers. By constructing these models, students explored the Earth's crust, mantle, outer core and inner core, gaining a deeper appreciation for the structure and composition of our planet. This project tied into their studies on active Earth processes, such as plate tectonics and volcanic activity.

The exercise emphasised how models are used in science to represent complex systems and phenomena. Students learned to evaluate their models, discussing their accuracy and limitations, which is a fundamental skill in scientific inquiry.





Year 9 Students Study Atoms and Nuclear Decay

Our Year 9 students have been exploring the fascinating world of atoms and nuclear decay. They learned that while radiation can be harmful, it also has many beneficial uses. For instance, they discovered how X-rays, a form of radiation, are crucial for diagnosing broken bones. This study has helped them understand the dual nature of radiation—its potential risks and its invaluable applications. By examining these concepts, students gained a balanced perspective on how scientific advancements can be both powerful and safe when used responsibly.

Year 10 Students Explore the Wonders of the Universe

Our Year 10 students have embarked on an incredible journey through the cosmos, learning about the origins of the universe and the life cycles of stars. They delved into the fascinating process of star formation, from the birth of stars in nebulae to their eventual demise as supernovae or black holes.

The students also explored the evidence supporting the Big Bang theory, such as cosmic microwave background radiation and the expansion of the universe. These studies have provided them with a deeper understanding of how the universe began and continues to evolve.

Year 11 Biology Students Explore Multicellular Organisms

Our Year 11 Biology students recently delved into the fascinating world of multicellular organisms by studying their systems in detail. As part of this exploration, they conducted dissections of fish gills and insects to gain a hands-on understanding of how these organisms function.

Dissecting fish gills allowed students to observe the intricate structures involved in respiration, highlighting how fish extract oxygen from water. Similarly, examining insects provided insights into their unique respiratory systems, such as tracheae and spiracles, which differ significantly from those of vertebrates.

Year 12 Biology Students Visit Canberra Hospital Our Year 12 Biology students recently had the opportunity to visit The Canberra Hospital. The visit also included discussions with medical professionals who explained the processes involved in diagnosing and studying diseases. These insights were invaluable, offering students a glimpse into the real-world applications of their studies and the importance of pathology in medical science.
